Our Commitment

GLC is committed to procuring goods and services in an efficient, ethical, and sustainable manner.

Our Approach

GLC acknowledges that sustainable procurement enables long term financial resilience while minimising impacts on the community and environment. To maximise value for our customers, stakeholders, and the communities in which we operate, we will:

- Uphold ethical practices, comply with the Modern Slavery Act (2018), and consider human rights and labour practices in alignment with ISO 20400: Sustainable Procurement Guidelines.
- Source sustainably and ethically, whilst preferencing:
 - Local suppliers – within the Local Government Area/s
 - Australian and New Zealand Small to medium business
 - Regional and Australian suppliers
 - Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander suppliers and Social Enterprises
- The tender evaluation of all high impact procurement packages will consider environmental and social aspects through a multi criteria analysis amounting to a minimum of 20% of the total commercial assessment, including:
 - Health, Safety, Environment, Quality, HR/IR, and Sustainability performance
 - Past Performance, Legacy, and Reputation
 - Assessment and mitigation of Modern Slavery risks in accordance with the Gamuda Australia Modern Slavery Policy.
 - Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander participation
- Require suppliers and subcontractors, within their own supply chains, to:
 - Maximise local content.
 - Investigate opportunities to reduce resource consumption (including the feasibility of renewables), minimise waste or divert from landfill, and reduce the embodied carbon of high materiality construction materials such as concrete, steel and asphalt.
 - Engage Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and businesses.
- Stimulate innovation through procurement to enhance whole-of-life environmental, social, and economic outcomes and reward exemplary performance within our supply chain.
